ROSC: Unlocking Recovery in Forth Valley

Aim

This 2 day learning and development opportunity has been designed in collaboration with Forth Valley Alcohol and Drug Partnership. The event is targeted at practitioners delivering services in Forth Valley whose role involves supporting the long-term recovery of people directly and indirectly affected by problematic alcohol and other drug use.

Overview

Long-term recovery from problematic alcohol and other drug use has no right or wrong route and it can mean different things to different people at different times. Individuals having access to the right support services and interventions at the right time will contribute to enabling them to move forward along their recovery pathways into sustained long term recovery. Best practice will require a seamless interface between local services. A Recovery Orientated System of Care (ROSC) is a network of formal and informal services developed to initiate and maintain recovery for individuals and families impacted by problematic alcohol and other drug use.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Recognise their service's role and responsibility in a Forth Valley Recovery Orientated System of Care.
- Explain the key components of recovery capital necessary to initiate and sustain recovery, and their service's role in contributing to mobilising its development.
- Review the practice of person-centred planning in recovery management within their service.
- Evaluate how, as a practitioner and as a service, they are adapting to Recovery Orientated Systems of Care consistent practice in the care of people affected by problematic alcohol and other drug use in Forth Valley.
- Set out a personal improvement plan on how they intend to build on their strengths in a Recovery Orientated System of Care following a critical reflection on current practice within the context of their own service.
